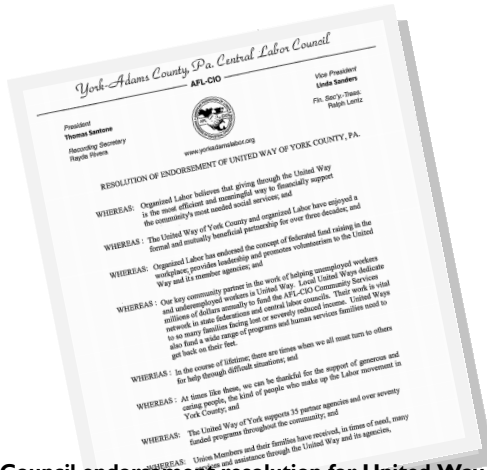

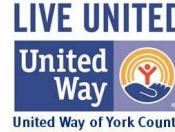

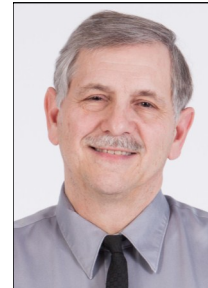
## Your Community Services Liaison is here to help.

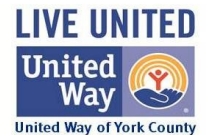

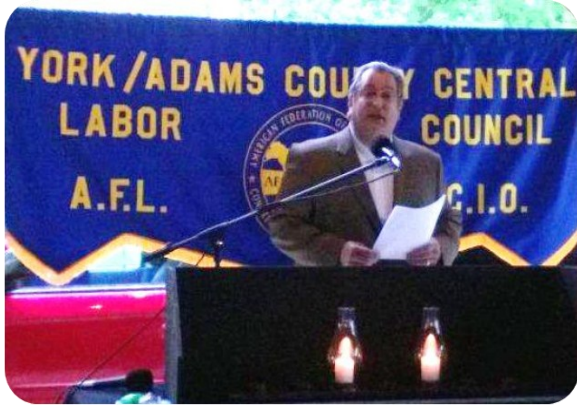
