Who is ALICE?

ALICE is an acronym for **Asset Limited, Income Constrained, Employed** –households that earn more than the Federal Poverty Level, but less than the basic cost of living for the county (the ALICE Threshold). **They are working, sometimes two or three jobs but still struggling to keep up with the rising cost of inflation.**

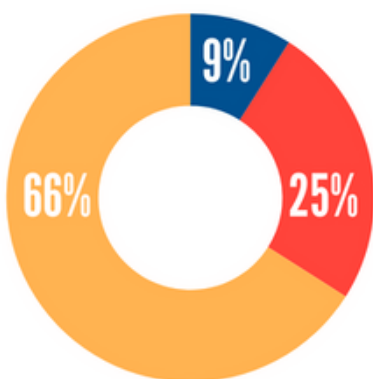

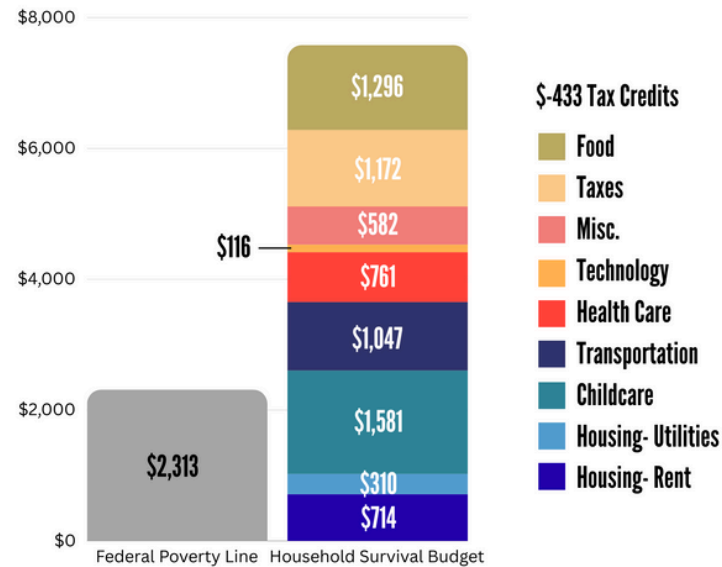

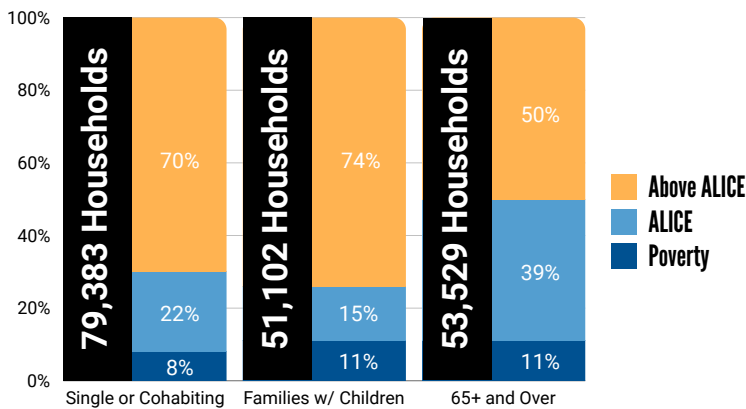
ALICE in York County
